Thursday August 10th will see the Year 10 to Year 11 2018 Subject Selection Event to be held in the Emmaus Hall from 3:00 – 5:00pm.

As part of the College's Careers program, Year 10 students have already been provided information and engaged in activities designed to look at career options and subject pathways for their senior education. The Senior Subject Handbook is available on the Emmaus College website under Curriculum/Subject Selection.

As a parent/carer you play an important role in helping your child make educational choices and career decisions, and so we encourage you to read through this Subject Selection Handbook with your son/daughter. From 1:40 – 3:00, during class time, there will be an opportunity for students to discuss options with Heads of Faculty. From 3:00 – 5:00 pm you and your child are invited to speak with the staff and the Careers & Workplace Learning Co-ordinator to gain important information about each subject area. In addition, there will be opportunities to meet representatives from Central Queensland University & TAFE, apprenticeship companies and private training providers.

Interviews

These interviews are optional and Year 10 students and their parents wanting to book an interview are asked to contact the College. Interviews are available between Monday Aug 14th and Friday Aug 18th (or by alternative arrangements).

Subject Selection

Online subject selection will open from **Tuesday Aug 8th**, and printed receipts and a signed Subject Reflection Form, listing the subjects chosen, are due into the Main Street office by **Friday Aug 18th**.
