EB Negotiations Update

Please find below important points related to the current enterprise bargaining negotiations being conducted between Catholic Education and staff represented by their union.

- Catholic Education (as the employer) has offered a 2.5% wage increase including a guarantee to match whatever wage increase is awarded to state school teachers if that %wage increase is higher than 2.5%.
- Catholic Education has committed to backpay non-teaching staff to 1 May 2015 and teaching staff to 1 July 2015.
- The union's comparisons with NSW are irrelevant. The systems have many points of difference across classifications and throughout working conditions.
- Term-time staff employed by Catholic schools currently receive an allocation of pro-rata holidays based on 4 weeks annual leave.
- Catholic Education through the negotiation period has agreed to 17 employee claims in-principle.

Catholic Education remains committed to reaching settlement in these negotiations as soon as possible.



Aiden ready for take off in promising pilot career

Year 12 student Aiden Hasan has been obsessed with flying from a young age, and he is well on his way to making it his career.

The Year 12 student is on the cusp of his first solo flight as a pilot, having completed the theory element of his pilot's license test.

'I was supposed to do my first solo flight over the holidays at RAAF Amberley but unfortunately three of their planes used for the flights were out of action for maintenance.'

Aiden, who is also active in the local cadet program, will return to Brisbane at the conclusion of this term to complete the flight.

It will see him reach an altitude of 3000 feet and carry out numerous emergency and radio communication procedures to gain his provisional license.

According to Aiden, it is a good time to become a pilot.

'The Air Force and also commercial airlines such as QANTAS are short on pilots. Over the next couple of years they'll both be doing the most pilot recruiting they've done in a long time.'

'Ideally I'd like to go straight into the Air Force and do my officer training, then another three years from that I could be a pilot. If not, I think I'd also like to go commercial.'
