## FROM THE HEAD OF SPIRITUALITY AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT



A major focus of Making Jesus Real is the concept of WELCOMING. How do we treat those around us? Are we supportive of those in our community? Generous in the way we speak, treat and forgive others? Do we stand up for our rights and the rights of others? The Catholic Community we want to become is a JUST school where

students and staff STAND UP for **their** Rights and the Rights of **others**.

A cohesive, supportive community requires growth in the skills required to identify the dynamics of our relationships, the **context** of problems as they arise in our relationships and the ability to formulate solutions or ways of dealing with concerns

where there is an imbalance of power leading to conflict or bullying within our relationships.

In so many ways we need to, “Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.” **Proverbs 21:8**. We must, according to Isaiah, “Learn to do good; seek justice and correct oppression.” But all of this takes knowledge and practice.

The Emmaus College Counselling Team have been developing the concept of a “Stand Up School,” with a focus to: respond to and help prevent behaviour regarded as bullying within our community through the integration of knowledge, skills and values for healthy relationships and raising awareness of bullying and appropriate ways to respond.

The Premise of ‘A Stand Up School’ involves the development of a whole school culture that ‘Stands Up’ to bullying. Through engaging students in developmentally appropriate activities it is hoped that students will own the ‘Stand Up’ culture and it will become a central part of who we are as a school.

Still in its infancy, the concept has been introduced on the Middle School Campus through a series of ‘Flash Events,’ involving senior students in morph suits setting up human sculptures in each of the lunch areas, staff rooms and the library to expose students to ‘The Pose’ (see photos below). ‘The Pose’ is representative of the communication style and dynamics that accompany bullying behaviour. ‘The Pose’ intends to provide young people with an image of what bullying looks like, its impact on others and the choices available to manage this. Further ‘Flash Events’ and follow up activities in class during the remainder of the year will further develop the understanding and ownership of a ‘Stand Up’ culture within our community.



Though early in its development the ‘Stand Up’ school philosophy supports and enhances our commitment to Making Jesus Real in our community through positive relationships so that, as it says in Romans 12:18, “If possible, so far as it depends on us, we may live peaceably with all.”

### Year 8 Camp



- Test materials, complete calculations and design a solution. This is presented to the engineer.
- Construct their solution
- Test their solution against the criteria/constraints and evaluate


